



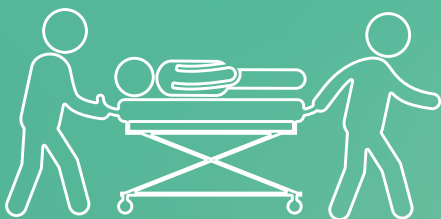

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has been established in Hong Kong for 138 years. It was first started in 1884 in the name of “Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association” and inaugurated in 1900. The **Brigade** was formally established in 1916 during World War I, followed by the establishment of the **Council** in 1949 after World War II. In 2015, Hong Kong was upgraded as a **Priory** of the Order of St. John. As an ex-officio member of the Grand Council of the Order, Hong Kong ever since then has a broader scope of involvement in international policies and activities.

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance has been well-known in the provision of First Aid training and Ambulance services to the general public in Hong Kong. The principle and spirit of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance as embodied in the motto “**For the Service of Mankind**” remain unchanged after the enactment of the new **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Incorporation Ordinance (Chapter 1164)** on 27 June 1997. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance continues in promoting and encouraging all works of humanity and charity for the relief of distress, suffering, sickness, danger and poverty without any distinction as to colour, class or creed.

The **Council** is the supreme governing body of **Hong Kong St. John Ambulance** and is charged with the governance, management and control of all businesses and activities of the Corporation. The Council is composed of dedicated volunteers from various professions and the Assistant Director (Administration and Policy) of the Department of Health also sits in the Council as an observer. The Council’s work is facilitated by its standing Committees, namely, Two MacDonnell Road Management, Finance, Honours and Awards, Public Relations, Property Management and Development, Greater China Affairs, Ambulance Service Steering and Information Technology.

The **Association**, the training branch, has been the premier organization of the territory responsible for instructing members of the general public the principles and practice of First Aid, Home Nursing and allied subjects since 1884. The **Director’s Conference** ensures that training works of the Association are conducted effectively and efficiently. There are 530 volunteer lecturers or instructors, including doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and non-professionals.

The **Brigade**, the service branch, is responsible for organizing training and equipping adult and youth members to undertake, on a voluntary basis, First Aid, Home Nursing, Ambulance and Community Services to those in need. The services are free. The **Commissioner’s Conference** is responsible for overseeing the organization, administration, services provision and development of the Brigade. At present, there are 7,522 members, made up of 3,488 Adult and 4,034 Youth members including 100 members from St. John Pandas.



Serving the community through the voluntary work of St. John has given me great pleasure, pride and satisfaction. I would like to express my sincere appreciation and heartfelt gratitude to my fellow Members of the Council for their unflinching trust, valuable advice and strong support in my chairmanship, which are essential for meeting our challenges all along and ahead.

The fiscal year 2021/2022 continued to be a difficult one for the organization as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. All our trainings, first aid duties and ambulance services were intermittently disrupted. Nevertheless, we could still arrange substantial training activities through E-learning and webinar. The number of students trained by the Association last year was 82,394 or 166% of the previous year (49,544). In fact, it was better than that before the pandemic, while subvention from the Department of Health required 21,000 participants only. At the same time, first aid duties, dental activities and ambulance services were recovering. The Brigade provided 67,430 man-hours of first aid, dental and community services or 547% of the previous year (12,317), but it was only about 30% of that just before the pandemic or 40% of our performance indicator of 170,000 man-hours annually! As our insurance plan did not cover infectious disease contracted during voluntary works, we had to hire more ambulance staff to replace voluntary first-aiders. This increased our financial burden substantially. On the other hand, our ambulance staff had to take extra precautionary measures for infectious disease protection, and extra hours in ambulance cleansing after transporting confirmed or suspected COVID-19 cases, as our ambulance team had the additional work of helping the Fire Services Department, the Auxiliary Medical Service and the Hospital Authority in transporting cases to and from hospitals, quarantine centres and residences. In addition, private hospitals refused emergency ambulance admissions, especially febrile cases. Added together, these contributed to the 8th consecutive year failing to meeting our performance indicators with the Department of Health, but it was noticeably better than last year (5,333 emergency and 774 non-emergency compared with our performance indicators of 7,000 emergency calls and 750 non-emergency duties). Recently, first-aiders volunteer to help in the ambulance service and hopefully we can meet our performance indicators once again.

St John has continued actively in helping the fight against COVID-19. As mentioned above, our ambulance service was busy in transporting COVID-19 confirmed or suspected cases to and from hospitals, quarantine centres or residences, especially during the 5th wave of the pandemic from February to April this year. First aid, medical consultation and ambulance support were provided to Mobile Cabin Hospital construction site workers starting from the end of February this year, including Tsing Yi, San Tin, Yuen Long Tam Mei, the Artificial Island of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge, Penny's Bay and Kai Tak. In response to the appeal of the Government, Outreach Vaccination Teams have been formed in March this year to provide CoronaVac vaccinations to the elderly and handicapped in Residential Care Homes. In addition, the Brigade mobilized volunteers in March to help the Government in packing anti-epidemic service bags for distribution to the general public. St. John members continue to be active and energetic during this difficult time of the community.

The All Hazards Disaster Response course newly introduced from the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians of the United States of America has finally been run twice in June last year. This course is particularly relevant in face of the pandemic.

After E-learning follows the St. John Mobile App, developed by G.T. (Ellen Yeung) College for St. John. It provides basic first aid knowledge, information on Hong Kong St. John Ambulance and courses update to the general public. With the formation of the Information Technology Committee under the chairmanship of Mr. Anthony Kwong Hao-kei, the IT Team has been developing three in-house systems i.e. Stock Inventory System, Membership Information System and Office Management System and they are all in good progress.



Active preparation has been kicked off since October 2021 under the chairmanship of Dr. Peter Wong Cho-yiu for an exhibition at the Hong Kong Museum of Medical Sciences titled **“Prehospital Cardiac Resuscitation – Past and Present”**. Valuable and interesting old documents, manuals and equipment have been donated or on loan from members and friendly sales agents. Unfortunately, the 5th wave of COVID-19 forced us to postpone. Hopefully, a suitable alternative timeslot can be identified in the near future. At least, it has aroused the awareness of our members the need and value of keeping our used documents and equipment for historical purposes.

St. John has been lagging behind for decades with the trend for specialization and modernization of its ambulance service, which remains at the basic level. An Ambulance Training Task Group has been formed and held its first meeting in December 2021, and hopefully we can catch up with the tide.

With the growth of the organization, demand for training, meeting and office facilities has put us under pressure. A plan to redevelop the Kowloon Command Headquarters back to a Mainland Command Headquarters has just been endorsed in principle by the Council in April this year.

My St. John dream is to train up our ambulance crew to internationally recognized level and to have all school students trained in First Aid. I shall work hard towards this direction during my term of office.

The achievement and success that have been made by Hong Kong St. John Ambulance would not be possible without the full dedication and commitment of our volunteers and staff, who have served conscientiously to uphold the highest tradition of St. John in every way. To them, I wish to express my sincere thankfulness and appreciation for their admirable work. In addition, the generosity and guidance of the Department of Health, Home Affairs Bureau, Hong Kong Jockey Club, Community Chest and other donors keep us on the right track to respond to the needs of our local community, enabling the continuation and expansion of our services and works.

I am confident that St. John will grow from strength to strength and strive to provide better services for the community. Glory goes to every member of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance.

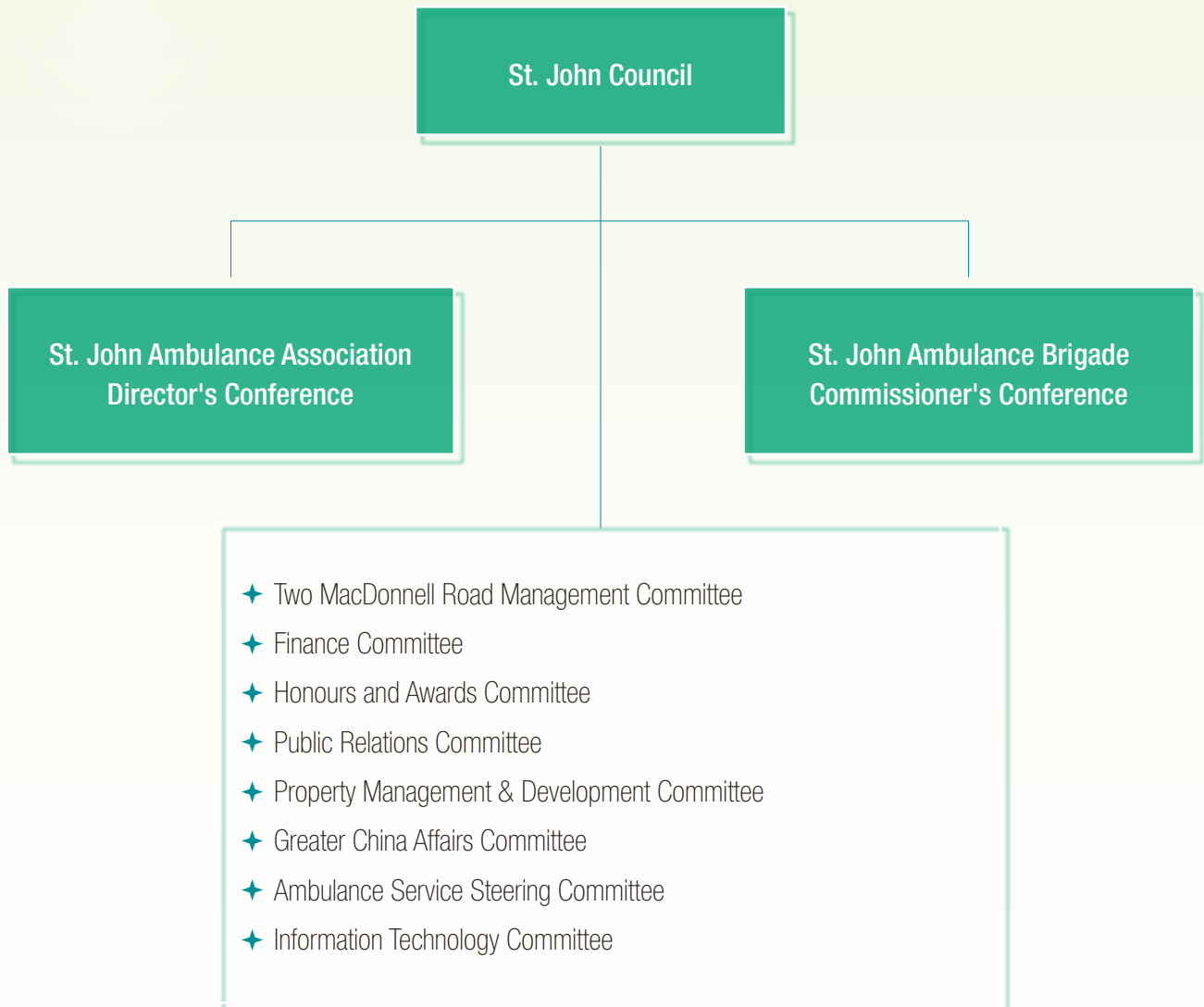

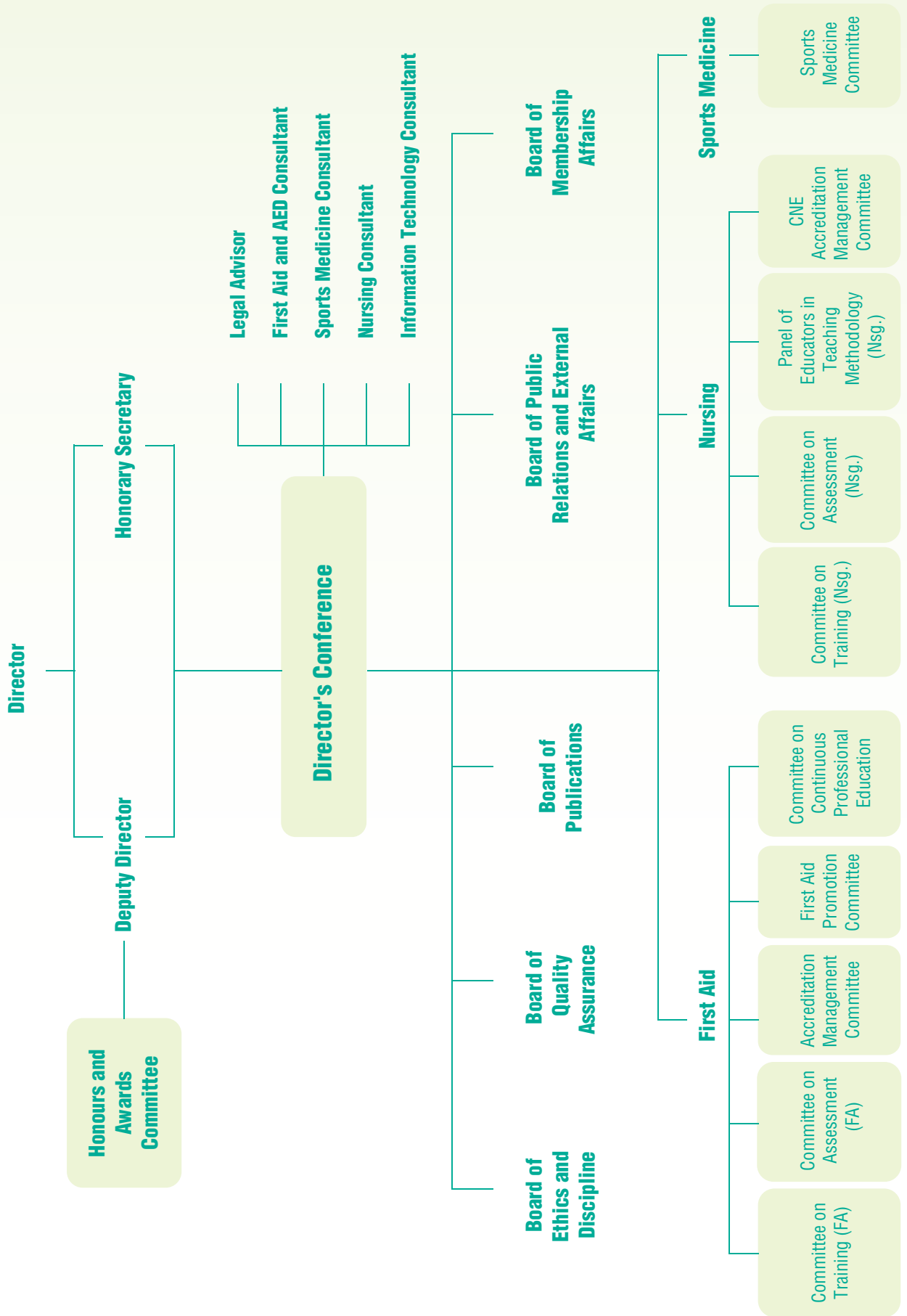

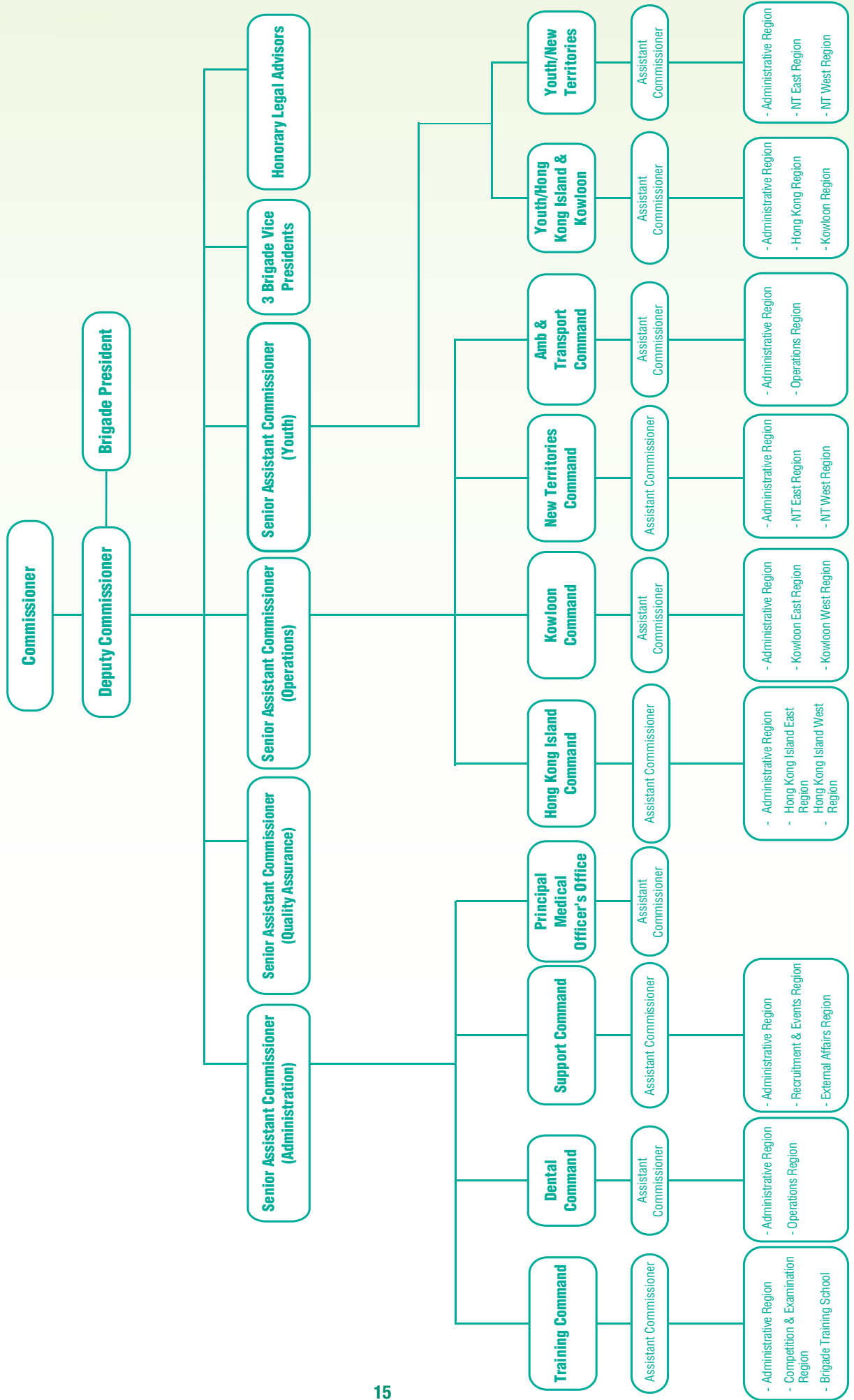

1. **Annual General Meeting 2021** was held on Thursday, 24 June 2021 at the Aw Boon Haw Hall, Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Headquarters. **The Honourable Mrs. Carrie LAM CHENG Yuet-ngor, GBM, GBS**, the Chief Executive of The HKSAR and President of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance attended the said meeting.



2. The St. John Priory of Hong Kong supported The Order of St. John in **"Light Up for St. John's Day"**. Two premises, Hong Kong Island Command Headquarters and Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Control Centre cum Sheung Shui Ambulance Depot were lit up in gold during the evening of Thursday, 24 June 2021 to celebrate St. John's Day and take the opportunity to say thank you to St. John volunteers and staff who have been working tirelessly especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.





3. An **Investiture and Presentation of Prior's Commendation** was held at St. John's Cathedral on Saturday, 27 November 2021. The Prior of The St. John Priory of Hong Kong, Dr. Chung Chin-hung presented the St. John Insignia to 18 award recipients with 2 Commanders, 6 Officers and 10 Members who had been admitted to or promoted in the Order as a result of having demonstrated successfully their leadership, integrity and notable service to the organization.

In the same occasion, 4 St. John personnel, including 2 ambulance staff, 1 officer and 1 member of the Brigade received Prior's Commendation in recognition of their participation in the successful resuscitation of the lives of 2 patients in cardiac arrest by performing Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) during an ambulance duty on 10 August 2020, and during a race duty on 5 April 2021 respectively.



4. Provision of First Aid Service at Mobile Cabin Hospitals

St. John Brigade has deployed over 200 personnel to provide first aid standby services at 6 Mobile Cabin Hospitals during their construction period, to ensure there was a safe and secure environment for those construction workers since 27 February 2022.





5. Formation of St. John Outreach Vaccination Team

In view of the surge of the 5th wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong, there was an alarming increase in the death rate among the elderly in Residential Care Homes (RCHs) who had not been vaccinated. In order to suppress the spread of infected cases within the elderly centres and to reduce the source of infection, St. John has mobilized over 250 personnel including Doctors, Nurses, Dentists, First Aid Lecturers, Officers and Members for setting up a **St. John Vaccination Team (The Team)** within one week, in early March 2022. The Team aims at providing outreach vaccination service to those elderly or handicapped residents at Residential Care Homes for taking at least the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccination. Adhered to our motto “For the Service of Mankind”, the Team visited infection-prone centres to assess and vaccinate the residents. The Team visited 19 RCHs within one week with 346 doses of vaccines given. As follow-up, St. John started the second round of booster COVID vaccination in late March 2022, followed by the third round.





6. E-learning for Elementary First Aid (8-hour) 『聖約翰急救在線』網上課程

The E-learning mode of Elementary First Aid was launched in September 2021. The course objective is to facilitate junior school students to acquire basic principles of First Aid in a flexible way. Considering the severe epidemic situation and class suspension, the Association has sponsored 20,000 quotas for Primary 3 to Secondary 3 students, which was in collaboration with Hong Kong Federation of Education Workers, LegCo members Mr. Edmund Wong Chun-sek, Mr. Chu Kwok-keung and Mr. Tang Fei in March 2022.



7. St. John Mobile Apps

With the kind assistance of G.T. (Ellen Yeung) College (Secondary Section), the **St. John Mobile Apps** have been launched to the public in April 2022.

8. Transfer of Patients to/from Queen Elizabeth Hospital

As the Government announced the Queen Elizabeth Hospital (QEH) be converted into a designated hospital to look after COVID-19 patients, those non COVID-19 patients had to be transferred to other hospitals within a very short period of time. At the request of the Department of Health and the Hospital Authority, St. John helped to transfer over 80 patients to/from QEH from 9-13 March 2022.



9. Provision of Emergency Ambulance Service

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the demand from the public for emergency ambulance service remains high. St. John has assisted the Fire Services Department to handle over 360 emergency ambulance cases since January 2022.



10. Education Bureau QF Star Training Provider

『QF 星級培訓機構』

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association has been awarded the QF Star Training Provider 『QF 星級培訓機構』 by the Education Bureau for active application of Qualifications Framework in providing multi-learning pathway.



11. Employees Retraining Board (ERB) Outstanding Achievement Award (2020-21)

「年度嘉許表現持續優異培訓機構」

The Health Section of Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Association has been awarded the **ERB Outstanding Achievement Award for Training Body 2021-22** for the performance on implementing quality assurance measures.



12. Accreditation of Health Worker Training Courses

Courses of Health Section were granted accreditation at Quality Framework (QF) from the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications, namely, Certificate in Health Worker Training Course has been re-accredited successfully at QF Level 3 until 30 June 2026; Certificate in Advanced Training for Health Workers has been accredited successfully at QF Level 3 from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2026 and Foundation Certificate in Training for Care Workers has been accredited successfully at QF Level 2 from 1 April 2022 to 30 June 2026.

13. Accreditation of Certificates in First Aid

The course of Certificate in First Aid has been re-accredited by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications at QF Level 3 from 1 October 2021 to 30 September 2025. The Employees Retraining Board has appointed Hong Kong St. John Ambulance as the sole provider of Foundation Certificate in Integrated First Aid Training (Part-time) for the year 2022-23.

14. The Secretary for Home Affairs' (SHA) Commendation Scheme aims at offering recognition to special achievements of individual volunteer leaders of each Uniformed Group under the purview of SHA in youth development works.

In 2020, Superintendent Yip Man-ki and Assistant Superintendent Kelvin Lo Man-fung of Youth Command were awarded the Volunteer Leader Commendation. While Senior Ambulance Officer Lam Tsz-ying and Ambulance Officer See Cheuk-ling were awarded the Youth Volunteer Leader Commendation in recognition of their outstanding and continuous contribution in youth services through the Hong Kong St. John Ambulance Brigade Youth Command.



1. During the reporting year, the Brigade discharged a total of 67,430 man-hours of volunteer first aid, ambulance duties, dental and community services for the public.
2. In 2021/2022, the Brigade responded to 6,107 emergency and non-emergency calls for ambulance services. A detailed breakdown of these calls is tabulated below for easy reference.

3. Dental Service

Dental service provided by Hong Kong St John Ambulance Brigade has been in operation for over 70 years.

Free dental service is made available to the elderly and patients with special needs by Brigade volunteer dental surgeons, dental surgery assistants and members at the Dental Clinic located at the St. John Headquarters or elderly homes by the Outreach Team. In addition, oral health services are provided to the public through campaigns and special events.

The fiscal year 2021/2022 was another challenging year for the dental service due to the 5th wave of COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong. As a result, the dental clinic and outreach service were completely suspended in February and March 2022. However, service has been continued through email to over 100 organizations to educate patients on oral hygiene by PowerPoint presentation.

In 2021/2022, volunteers in the Dental Command provided dental services to a total of 219 patients with 430 cases being treated in the dental clinic. In addition, 87 members of the general public received oral hygiene education and free consultation during the outreach service.

For the Public/Organizations

1. Jockey Club Heart-safe Community Project (賽馬會「顫動人心」社區計劃)



Funding has been granted from the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust for installation of automated external defibrillators and providing training programmes for 1,600 social service units for three years. The project has been carried out in collaboration with Red Cross, kicking off in December 2019 along with Public Educational Talk on learning first aid skills to the public.

As at 31 March 2022, 493 CPR and AED training courses were held with a total of 4,163 participants. Over 90% participants agreed that awareness on the importance of CPR and AED was enhanced and had confidence in using the AED and performing CPR after attending the course.

Around 473 public educational talks were organized, including 44 talks held online with 17,385 participants attended. Most of them agreed that the talks were useful and practical. 457 AEDs were installed in social service units and all were satisfied with the arrangements of installation.



2. Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO)

ALSO provider courses were jointly organized by the Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine and the Hong Kong College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists for the 11th consecutive year. Four ALSO courses were conducted on 13-14, 15-16, 19-20 and 21-22 April 2021 at St. John Tower with 144 nurses and doctors participated.





3. First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies

The Association was invited by the Hong Kong Playground Association to conduct a 16-hour First Aid Specialty Course on Sports Emergencies for staff of MacPherson Place on two consecutive Mondays, 10 and 17 May 2021.

The course aimed to enhance the awareness of benefits of sports injury prevention through theory and practical skills on sport first aid.



4. The Prince Philip Dental Hospital CPR/AED Drill

The Prince Philip Dental Hospital invited the Association to conduct a CPR/AED drill on 14 May 2021. The drill was designed to practice and reinforce the CPR/AED skills for staff members of the hospital, which took place at the Sterilization Room, OutPatient Department and Children's Dental Clinic.



5. Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) Course

The Association has launched the Advanced Medical Life Support course developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States since 2016. Apart from the didactic aspects, interactive simulations and problem solving scenarios have given participants realistic exposure to similar cases. Course participants were mainly doctors and nurses. In 2021, AMLS courses were conducted on two consecutive Saturdays, 29 May 2021 and 5 June 2021 with 23 participants attended.



6. All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) Provider Course

Developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT), supported by the American College of Emergency Physicians, the All Hazards Disaster Response (AHDR) course teaches students how to respond to different types of disaster scenario they may encounter, including natural disasters and infrastructure failings, fires and radiological events, pandemics, active shooter incidents, and other mass casualty events. AHDR educates participants on how to analyse potential threats in their area, assess available resources and create a response plan that will save lives. It is an 8-hour classroom course for Emergency Medical Service practitioners at all levels. Two AHDR courses were conducted on Thursday, 17 June 2021 and Friday, 25 June 2021, with 47 participants attended.





7. Cooperation with Employees Retraining Board (ERB) – Certificate in Health Worker Training

Certificate in Health Worker Training course was conducted between 30 March 2021 and 30 June 2022. 19 candidates have successfully completed the course. Some course materials i.e., high seat chair and wheel chair were donated to the Association to facilitate course delivery.



8. Free Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Training Courses for Members of the Public



The Sir Robert Ho Tung Charitable Fund has granted the Association funding for conducting free 6-hour CPR & AED training for members of the public since 2010. The project was conducted from 8 September 2021 to 21 January 2022. The number of participants was 2,214 with 45 courses. All qualified participants were awarded the Adult CPR and AED Provider Certificate with 3 years validity.

9. Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Education Projects of Rotary 2021-2022

The Association has been invited by the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Northeast, collaborating with Hong Kong College of Cardiology to conduct the CPRAED course for members of the public for the 6th year with over 500 members of the public trained in the project this year and the targeted beneficiaries were students and staff from schools.



10. Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course

The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) has granted the Association a license of conducting Basic Life Support in Obstetrics (BLSO™) Provider Course since 2017. The course objective is to provide training of pre-hospital care providers who wish to increase their knowledge and skills in the field of obstetrics. In the past few years, over 400 participants were trained through 21 courses. In 2021-22, the course was conducted on Sunday, 15 August 2021 with 22 candidates attended.

11. Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course (PETFA)

Pet First Aid and Emergency Care Course was launched in 2015, which has grown in popularity since the first class. For 2021 and 2022, eleven classes were held with over 300 participants, including group class of “Hong Kong Guide Dogs Association”.

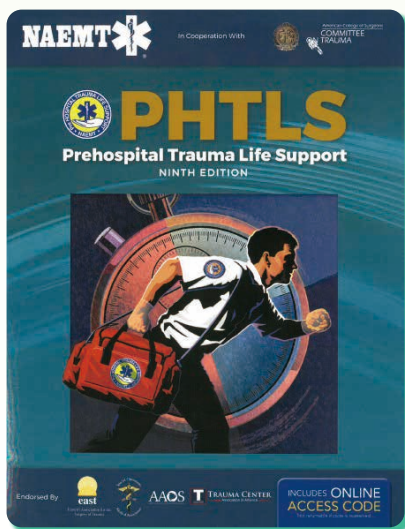
The Association was invited by the Regional Crime Prevention Office Kowloon East, Animal Watcher Programme to join a Pet Event 『東九龍動物嘉年華』 which was conducted on Sunday, 8 August 2021 at Vessel 01 and 02, Kwun Tong Bypass. A booth was set up to promote the St. John Pet First Aid Course.





12. Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Courses

The Association has become the sole provider of PHTLS courses in Hong Kong since 2002. The course was developed by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT) of the United States and was introduced into Hong Kong by the China-Hong Kong Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. This two-day intensive course gives instructions on kinematics of injuries, assessment and management of trauma patients with multiple injuries. Prospective trainees include doctors, nurses and pre-hospital care providers. Seven courses were conducted from April 2021 to March 2022 with 195 candidates attended.



The 9th Edition of the Course Manual has been in use since 2021.

13. Health Worker Training Course 『護理員訓練基礎證書（自資）』課程

Due to the shortage of manpower of health workers for elderly homes, the Association conducted 『護理員訓練基礎證書（自資）課程』 to attract job seekers to join the field of care sector. The objective of the course is to provide fundamental skills of nursing and care-giving to the participants. Certificate holders are eligible to work as a Care Worker at elderly homes, residential care homes for the elders with special needs and COVID-19 quarantine facilities. The course was conducted from 29 to 31 March 2022 with 20 participants attended.

2. Home Nursing Instructional Videos

To enhance the practical skills of Home Nursing Lecturers, the Nursing Committee of the Association organized a shooting for instructional videos on 25 September 2021 at St. John Tower. The videos demonstrated the best practices in Continuous Assessment, including the measurement of vital signs, wound cleaning, vomit handling and so on.



1. The **Annual Service of Dedication** was held on Sunday, 20 June 2021 at St. John's Cathedral. Mr. Joseph Leung Wai-hung, FSDSM, Director of Fire Services attended the Service and read the Second Lesson.



2. In order to observe the social distancing requirement during the COVID-19 pandemic, the **Remembrance Sunday** held on Sunday, 14 November 2021 at St. John Memorial, Wong Nai Chung Gap Road were attended by Dr. Chung Chin-hung, Council Chairman, Mr. Alfred Poon Sun-biu, Brigade Commissioner and Dr. Donald Li Kwok-tung, Association Director only. Wreaths were laid during the Service to show respect and in memory of the 56 Officers and Members of the Brigade who lost their lives during the World War II.





3. Participation in Packing the Anti-epidemic Service Bags

As substantial manpower was required by the Government in the packing of the anti-epidemic service bags urgently, St. John Brigade responded swiftly by mobilizing volunteer members to help packing the service bags. Three teams were formed by over 60 volunteers in a short period of time and assisted in the packing work from 30-31 March 2022.



4. Virtual Reality and First Aid Training

In view of growing popularity on the use of Virtual Reality (VR), as well as to enhance the learning interest of cadet members in first aid training, the first phase of a VR scenario (which is related to the assessment and first aid treatment for a casualty in a virtual school) was developed. This VR game has enabled the players to experience performing first aid virtually, as well as enhanced public's awareness, interest and knowledge in first aid. In view of the favourable comments from users of different age groups, additional funding support has been obtained from the Home Affairs Bureau (HAB) this year to develop the Phase 2 VR project on other virtual scenarios for first aid training, which is targeted for completion by the end of 2022.





5. Development of International and Local Youth Advisory Systems

Hong Kong St. John Ambulance continues to take an active role in the International Youth Advisory Network (IYAN) in 2021-22 through the participation of Youth representatives. Despite IYAN is under the lead of the St. John International with representatives coming from different St. John Priories over the world, all members share the same vision, i.e. to build a better future for St. John. In fact, youth opinion has been regarded as one of the key successful factors to create and evolve new management of the Order with time, and continuous effort has been put in order to achieve this both internationally and locally. Similarly, with the help from the youth leaders (who are at present serving in different units of the Youth Command), the Hong Kong Youth Advisory Network (HKYAN) has been established since 2021. Representatives have been able to contribute through providing their views on their needs and suggesting the future development of our services. Hong Kong St. John Ambulance will continue to make every endeavour to encourage our youth generations to further participate with an aim to induce further positive change to our services.

6. Publicity in various Local Media

- The Brigade Officers were invited to share their experiences in volunteering and introduce the works of St. John for RTHK programme 《精靈一點：健康速讀》 for 4 episodes which were broadcasted on 18 January 2022.



- The Training Manager, Mr. Richard Cheng Kam-wah was invited by TVB programme 《流行都市》 to introduce “Pet First Aid”, which was broadcasted on 20 January 2022 and 『癲癇症護理知識』, which was broadcasted on 10 February 2022.

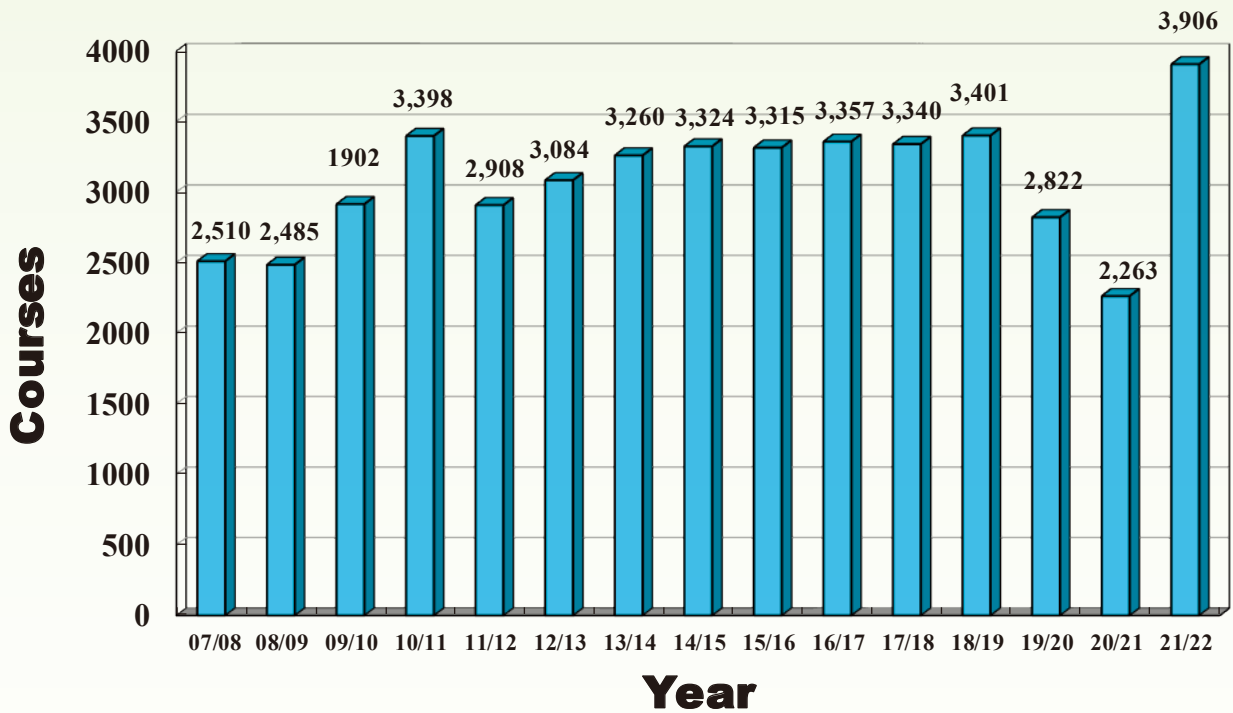

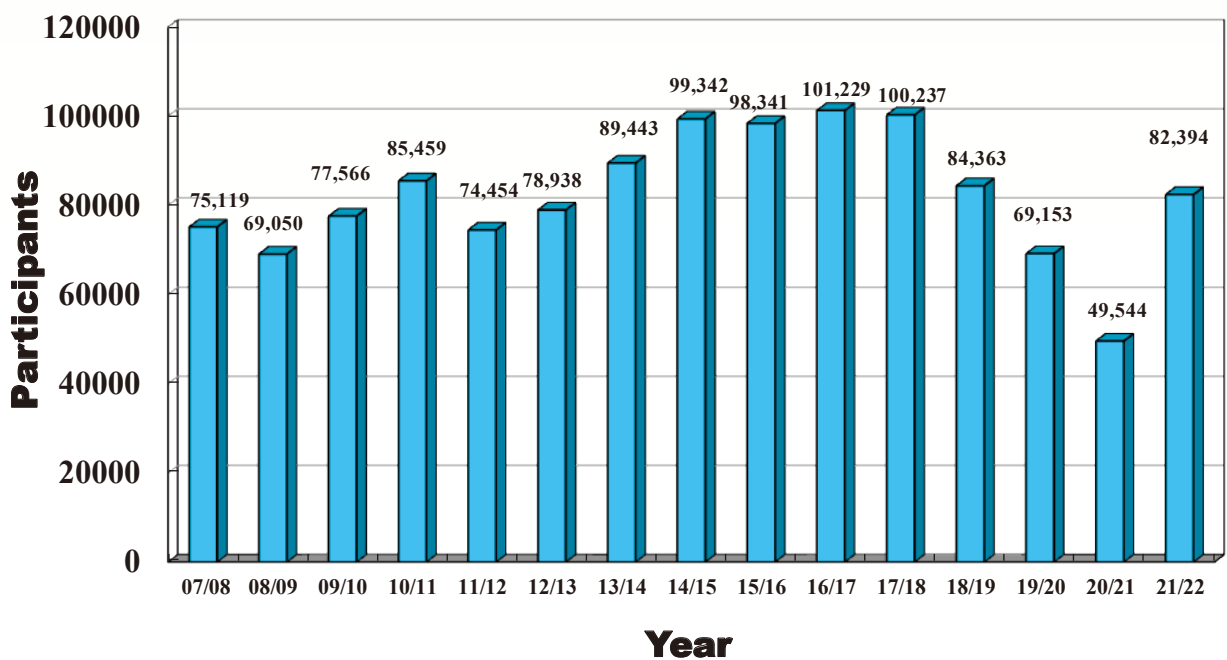

Total number of Training Courses conducted by the Association (2007-2022)

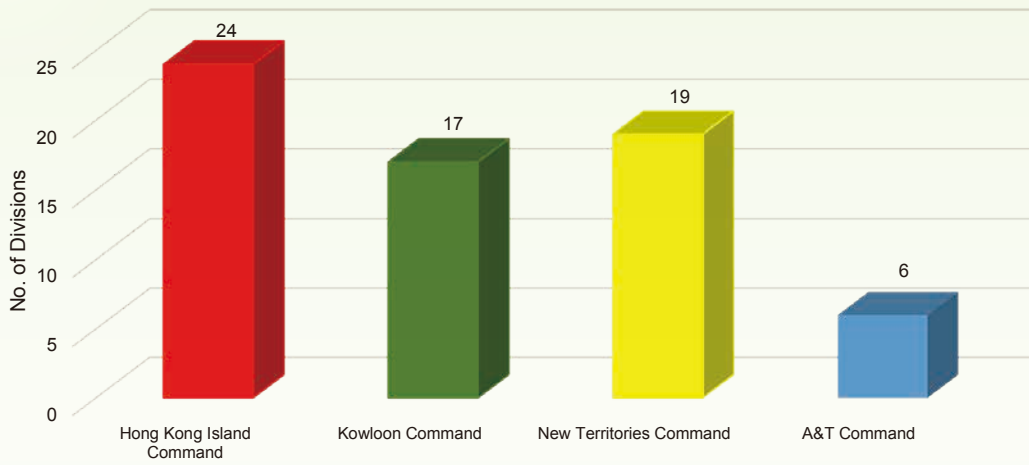


Total number of participants enrolled in Training Courses conducted (2007-2022)

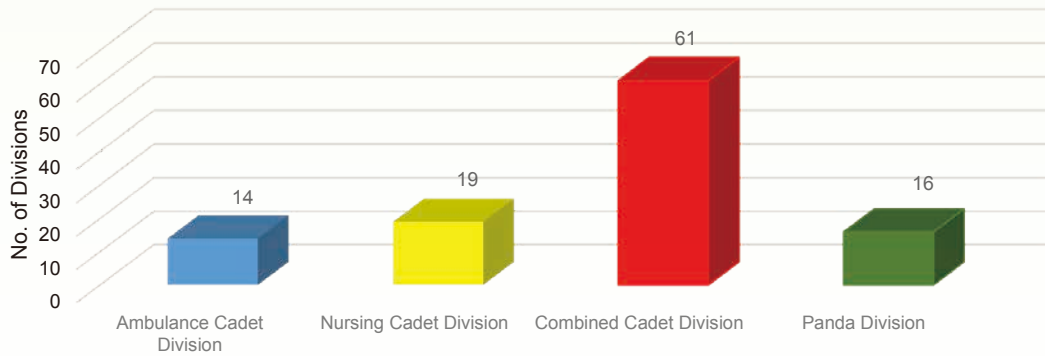




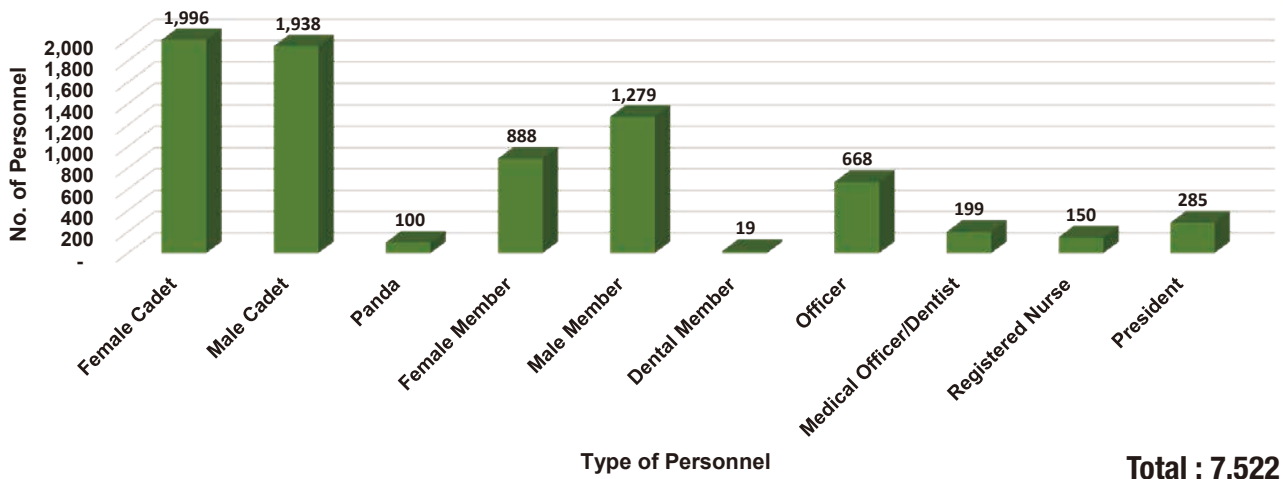
Number of Divisions in the Hong Kong Island / Kowloon / New Territories / Ambulance & Transport Command



Number of Divisions in the Youth Command

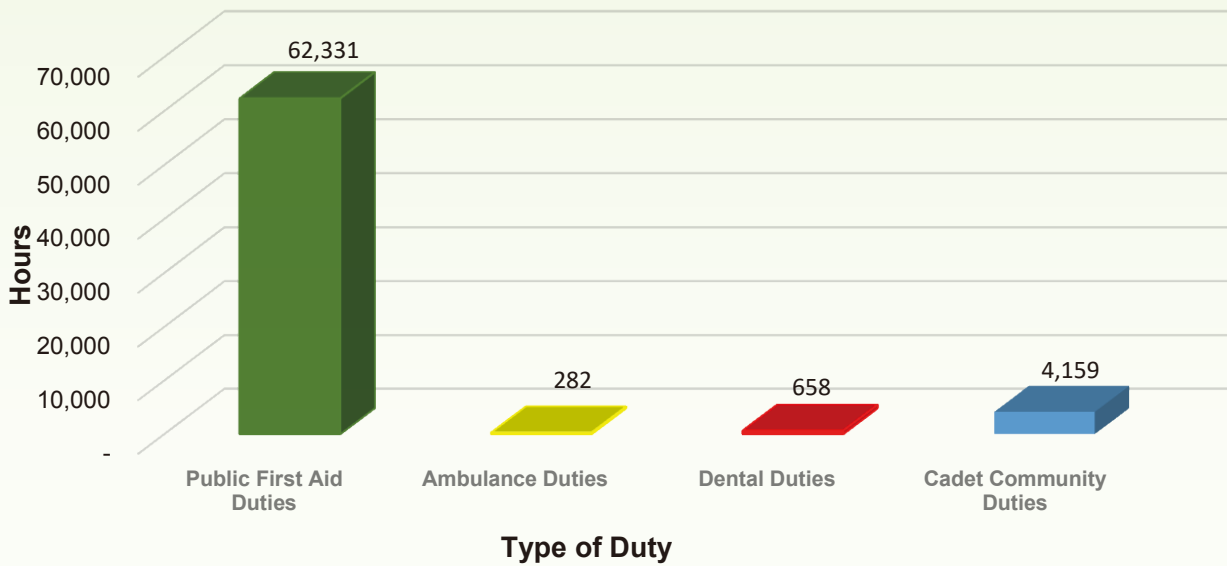


Strength of the Brigade as at 31 March 2022



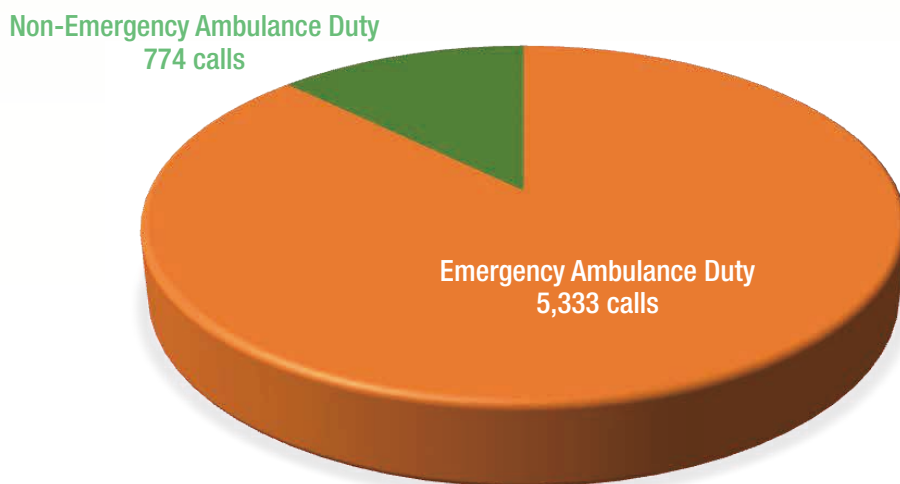


Number of Public Duty Hours undertaken by Brigade Volunteers during 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022
